Eligibility: 2025 applicants graduating from a Texas high school located within 100 miles of Pasadena, Texas, may apply. To be

eligible for a 2025 HOPE SCHOLARSHIP, student must have experienced the death of a biological parent or a sibling. We cannot consider other extended family members, such as grandparents or stepparents. Each eligible applicant must complete the enclosed packet.

Three independent reviewers will consider community service essays, writings reflecting personal obstacles and experiences, as well as paragraphs about applicants' aspirations and hopes for the future. Only complete packets submitted by the March 24, 2025 deadline will be reviewed.

*An awards reception to honor the HOPE SCHOLAR Class of 2025 will be held on Tuesday evening, May 13, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at Memorial Baptist Church, 6901 Fairmont Parkway, Pasadena, Texas. Students MUST attend the ceremony to be eligible to receive monetary awards. No exceptions.

In loving memory of Valerie Grace Wheeler

Yesterday is but a dream, tomorrow is only a vision; but today, well lived, makes every yesterday a dream of happiness and every tomorrow a vision of HOPE.

Valerie Grace Wheeler learned that she had cancer when she was barely a teenager, having celebrated her 13th birthday a few short months before receiving the harsh news of her diagnosis of metastatic Ewing's sarcoma.

Words seem inadequate to describe this exceptional young woman. Friends and family called her Val, while many called her "Amazing Grace." Astounding everyone with her determination, courage, positive attitude, and spiritual strength, Valerie touched hundreds of people throughout her experience with cancer. She died June 25, 1999, at age 15, before she could begin her sophomore year of high school.

Valerie was an honors student at Sam Rayburn High School, a talented artist, an outstanding athlete, and most of all, a person who had true compassion for others. Because of her faith in God, she believed in the hope that each new day could bring.

The Hope Scholarship seeks to recognize outstanding young people like Valerie who value education, believe in service to others, and have worked hard to overcome obstacles in the course of their studies.

Only Texas residents living within 100 miles of Pasadena may apply. Applicants (seniors) must have experienced the death of a sibling or parent. (We are unable to consider the death of grandparents and other extended family members, such as stepparents.) This educational scholarship must be applied to expenses related to college, technical, or trade school. Application deadline is Monday, March 24, 2025. All applications must be postmarked by March 24, 2025 to be considered. Absolutely NO EXCEPTIONS.

- 2. Attach a copy of your high school transcript.
- 3. Describe your participation in volunteer community service.

Be specific. Explain exactly what you have done to serve others. (This essay should be <u>at least 250 words</u>, typed, double-spaced 12 point font AND no more than two typed pages.) Refer to Essays Guide. This is a very important element of the application.

- 4. Explain the specific obstacles you have overcome in obtaining your high school education.
 - [i.e. family challenges, grief and loss related to death of family member, illness, health challenges, relationship issues, financial difficulties, etc.]

Note: Refer to Essays Guide. Your essay must be typed, double-spaced, 12 point font (suggested length: 250-500 words).

- 5. Describe your hopes and aspirations for the future.
 - (Refer to Essays Guide. This essay should be at least 250 words, typed, double-spaced, 12 point font <u>maximum of 500 words</u>).
- **6. Explain your plan for financing your education.** Include any scholarships or financial aid you expect to receive, pending, or have already received.
- **7. Attach two letters of recommendation.** One letter of recommendation must be from a teacher or school official, and the other letter should be from a person outside of the school system. (*Business person, religious official, community leader, etc. Letters may not be written by your family members or relatives.)*

<u>Note: This is very important.</u> These letters should include a description of the student's potential for success, as well as personal qualities that set student apart from classmates.

8. Attach a recent photograph of yourself. (PLEASE make sure the photo is clear and not distorted. Please ensure that all photos submitted are 4X6 or larger. If you do not have a photo that meets the required size, please include the largest that you have.)

Essays Guide

These are important suggestions to consider when writing your essays.

Community service essay

<u>Community Service:</u> <u>This is a very important segment of the application</u>.* PJH seeks to recognize and reward students who have made significant contributions to the community in spite of their own personal tragedy.

Applicant should express:

- a. A clear understanding of the value of community service and impact that community service has had on his/her personal life.
- b. The amount of hours, varied activities, and skills acquired through service to community

*If lack of community service is due to significant economic challenges placed on the family due to the death of family member, employment may be considered in lieu of community service. If this is the case, explain where you have worked, the amount of hours, activities, and skills acquired through employment.

Obstacles essay

Economic, social, emotional, psychological - any and all of these are relevant categories.

How have you responded to all challenges in your life? You must include an explanation of the impact of the death of your immediate family member on your life.

Goals essay

Include a very clear description of your college plans. Be specific. Provide an indication of major (or areas of emphasis) even though you may still be considering more than one field. Be sure to indicate your <u>future career path</u>. ** Why have you set these goals?

** No value judgments will be made regarding the value of a particular career compared to another. For instance, becoming a doctor is no more credible than becoming a business owner, plumber, or educator.
